Top Tips for writing

- 1. Start your reply like this: Nice to hear from you.
- 2. Make sure you answer all the questions.
- 3. Use I'd love to / I'd like to / it would be great to (+ a verb) to say what you want to do in the future.
- 4. Finish by saying **Looking forward to seeing you** + 'next Saturday', 'next month', 'soon', etc.
